The **armchair and ottoman** in the bedroom are from the Maxalto range at B & B Italia (020-7591 8111; www.bebitalia.it). The armchair, 88 x 77 x 105cm, costs from £1,760, and the ottoman, 44 x 75 x 34cm, costs from £428. Interior designer Giselle Mannering upholstered all the furniture in this room, and covered the chair and ottoman in soft green 'Desert Cloth' linen by de Le Cuona (020-7584 7677; www.delecuona.co.uk), £118.20 a metre.

BAR STOOLS

Giselle selected these Cappellini 'Hi Pad' bar stools for the kitchen. She chose them for their simplicity and covered them with leather that coordinates with the colour of the kitchen. They are available in a variety of shades, and prices start at £557 for an 80cm-high stool, from Viaduct (020-7278 8456; www.viaduct.co.uk).



LIGHTS

The white **pendant lights** in the dining area are part of designer Cecilie Manz's 'Caravaggio' series. The shades are made from drawn steel and coated in smooth, high-gloss paint. They are available from Funktionalley (01924-466040; www.funktionalley.com); prices start at £112 for the smallest, which measures 14.5 x 11cm.
